

Michigan Transfer Agreement Requirements: 2016 – 2017

What is the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA)?

As a Schoolcraft College student, and with the help of your academic advisor or counselor, you select general education courses from the list below, and when you transfer out to a MTA-receiving four-year college or university, your lower-level general education requirements should be satisfied!

What Are The *Minimum* MTA Requirements?

Discipline/Subject	Minimum Credits	Course Requirements
English Composition/Communication	6	ENG 101 & ENG 102 or ENG 101 & COMA 103 or ENG 102 & COMA 103 or ENG 102 & ENG 221 or ENG 221 & COMA 103
Humanities	4	Select two MTA courses from different subjects
Social Sciences	6	Select two MTA courses from different subjects
Natural Science	5	Select two MTA science courses, with one course containing a <i>lab</i> , from different subjects
Mathematics	3	Select at least one course from one of the following categories: College Algebra, Statistics, Quantitative Reasoning or an advanced level mathematics
Minimum Total MTA Credit Hours	30	Take additional MTA-approved courses to reach a minimum of 30 credit hours
