

Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program

Information and Application Packet 2012-2013

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program (CBPA) prepare students for baking and pastry chef careers which includes a variety of baked goods from artisan breads to European and classical pastry preparation. The program provides advanced training beginning with fundamentals through the most refined and advanced skills and techniques. Students learn and practice their art in the most advanced instructional kitchens in the Midwest, if not the entire country. Important information about the Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program:

- Thirty-two (32) students are admitted in the fall semester.
- Culinary Baking and Pastry courses are offered at the Livonia campus.
- Students in the Culinary Baking and Pastry program prepare baked goods and pastries sold in the American Harvest Restaurant and Main Street Café.
- Students who satisfactorily complete the Program Courses qualify for a Certificate of Program Completion.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program (CBPA) require an application (attached to the end of this packet). To be admitted to the program the student must complete the following:

1. Apply to Schoolcraft College	Apply to Schoolcraft College online at www.Schoolcraft.edu.
2. Transcripts	Submit official undergraduate college transcripts from all schools previously attended. College transcripts must be sent directly from the issuing college or university to Schoolcraft College.
3. Verify Transcripts	Contact the Admissions and Enrollment Center at 734-462-4426 to confirm that all official college transcripts have been received.
4. Counseling and Assessment	This program requires minimum assessment levels or course work in the areas of math, reading and writing. Students should meet with an academic advisor or counselor to develop an academic plan. They can determine if an assessment test is necessary and if foundation courses are needed. Students with prior college level work or a degree may be exempt from placement testing. Students who have submitted ACT scores that are less than three years old to Admissions and Enrollment Center may also be exempt from assessment testing.

5. Obtain Sanitation Certificate	Submit proof of a valid ServSafe certificate earned within the last five years to the Admissions or Enrollment Center. Students may prepare to complete this requirement by taking Schoolcraft's CAP 102 Culinary Sanitation course, Continuing Education class or other opportunities in the community.
6. Obtain a CBPA 103 Permit	Once all assessment requirements have been met and any necessary foundation coursework is completed, students must meet with a Schoolcraft counselor or academic advisor to obtain a permit to register for CBPA 103. Please note that CBPA 103 is restricted to regularly admitted students; Dual and Special high school students are not eligible.
7. College Prerequisite Coursework – CBPA 103	Complete CBPA 103 – <i>Introduction to Baking and Pastry Skills and Technique</i> with a grade of <u>2.5</u> or better. Your grade must be posted to your transcript before you submit a program application. CBPA 103 must be taken within five years of applying to the Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program.
7. Cumulative GPA	Attain a cumulative grade point average of <u>2.0</u> or better for all Schoolcraft college courses.
8. Apply to Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program	Submit the attached Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program Application to the Admissions and Enrollment Center with appropriate signatures.

CULINARY ARTS INFORMATION SESSION

The Culinary Arts Department highly recommends that you attend a Culinary Arts Campus Tour. This will include an information session to learn more about the Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Programs, application process and a tour of the facilities. APPLICATION PROCESS

The Admission and Enrollment Center is responsible for maintaining the acceptance list for the Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program. During the fall, winter, and summer semesters, the order of acceptance of qualified applicants will be based on the date the Admissions and Enrollment Center receives a valid application to the program. In the event that more than one qualified student applies on the same day for the last remaining spot, the order of acceptance will be as follows for semester placement:

- 1) Date of valid Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program application.
- 2) Grade earned in CBPA 103 Ranked high to low.
- 3) Residence:
 - United States Citizens and Resident Aliens.
 - Applicants who are residents of the College district.
 - 2. Applicants who are residents of the State of Michigan but who reside outside the College district.
 - 3. Applicants who reside outside of the State of Michigan.
 - B. Nonimmigrant Visa Holders (F1 visa holders are not eligible for the certificate only program.)

Applications that are turned in during the spring semester are put into a single pool which remains open until both CBPA 103 courses are complete. All valid applications received by this date will be ranked according to the following criteria:

Grade the applicant received in CBPA 103

OR

2) Grade received in Pastries II (if the applicant has completed the two-year CAP program in lieu of taking CBPA 103)

OR

3) Grade received in CAP 103 (if the applicant has completed the one-year CAP program in lieu of taking CBPA 103)

ACCEPTANCE NOTIFICATION

Applicants will be notified of acceptance by mail.

ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

Prior to the start of your acceptance term, you will receive detailed information about registration for the upcoming semester. Once accepted to the Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts Program, you will be required to register for at least 15 or 20 credit hours each semester. All Culinary Baking and Pastry Arts students are encouraged to meet with a counselor or academic advisor prior to registration to review course requirements and to discuss their overall educational plan.
