

## PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Emergency Medical Technology – Paramedic Program (EMT) is rigorous and challenging. It requires a high level of student commitment and mastery of content in many academic areas. Paramedic is a profession in which knowledge, skills, and judgment are critical. Important information about the EMT Program:

- Thirty-one (31) new students are admitted each fall and winter semester.
- Emergency Medical Technology courses are offered at the Radcliff campus in Garden City. Students admitted in the Fall attend classes during the day; Students admitted in the Winter attend classes in the evening. Courses are scheduled into three 15-week semesters; students complete the program in one year of full-time coursework/clinical.
- The Emergency Medical Technology program includes clinical practice requirements.
- Successful completion of the Emergency Medical Technology – Paramedic Program qualifies the individual to take the National Registry Exam. In addition, students who successfully complete all college/program requirements qualify for the Associate Degree in Applied Science Degree.
- All courses are approved by the Michigan Department of Community Health EMS and Trauma Systems Section.

## APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

The Emergency Medical Technology-Paramedic Program (EMT) requires an application (attached to the end of this packet). To be admitted to the program the student must complete the following:

<b>1. Apply to Schoolcraft College</b>	Apply to Schoolcraft College on-line at <a href="http://www.Schoolcraft.edu">www.Schoolcraft.edu</a> .
<b>2. Transcripts</b>	Request official undergraduate college transcripts from <u>all</u> schools previously attended. College transcripts must be sent directly from the issuing college or university to Schoolcraft College.
<b>3. Verify Transcripts</b>	Contact the Admissions and Enrollment Center at 734-462-4426 to confirm that all official undergraduate college transcripts have been received.
<b>4. Counseling and Assessment</b>	<p>This program requires minimum assessment levels or course work in the areas of math, reading and writing. Students should meet with an academic advisor or counselor to develop an academic plan. They can determine if an assessment test is necessary and if foundation courses are needed. Students with prior college level work or a degree may be exempt from placement testing. Students who have submitted ACT scores that are less than three years old to Admissions and Enrollment Center may also be exempt from assessment testing.</p> <p>Contact the Counseling Center at 734-462-4429 to make an appointment.</p>
<b>5. Biology Proficiency</b>	<p>Complete two semesters of high school level courses in Biology with a 2.0/C or better in both semesters. High school transcripts must be submitted to the Admissions and Enrollment Center as proof of completion.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">- or -</p> <p>Complete college class in Biology 050 or equivalent with a grade of 2.0/C or better.</p>
<b>6. College Prerequisite Coursework</b>	<p>Complete BIOL 105      Elementary Human Anatomy and Physiology with a grade of <u>2.0/C</u> or better.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">-or-</p> <p>Complete BIOL 236      <i>Human Anatomy and Physiology</i> with a grade of 2.0/C or better.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">-or-</p> <p>Complete BIOL 237 and BIOL 238      <i>Principles of Human Anatomy and Physiology 1</i> and <i>Principles of Human Physiology 2</i> with a grade of 2.0/C or better in both courses.</p> <p><b>Time Limits:</b> <i>Elementary Anatomy and Physiology</i> must be completed within 5 years of application. <b>7. Cumulative GPA</b>	Attain a cumulative grade point average of <u>2.0</u> or better for all college level prerequisites and supportive courses.
<b>8. Apply to Emergency Medical Technology Program</b>	Submit the attached Emergency Medical Technology – Paramedic Program Application to the Admissions and Enrollment Center with appropriate signatures.

## **APPLICATION PROCESS**

1. The order of acceptance of qualified applicants is based on the date the College receives a valid Emergency Medical Technology Program application.
2. Applications are received and processed on an on-going basis.  
For the purpose of fairness, applications received at the end of each semester will be held for three business days after final grades are available and then will be dated received.
3. In the event that more than one qualified student applies on the same day, the order of acceptance will be based on the student's cumulative grade point average at Schoolcraft College and then by residency if needed.
4. When the 31 qualified applicants have been accepted, students will be considered for acceptance into the next available semester.
5. Applications received from non-qualified students are returned and may be resubmitted after the application requirements are complete.

## **REGISTRATION PROCEDURE**

After acceptance into the Emergency Medical Technology – Paramedic program students require official authorization to register for Emergency Medical Technology – Paramedic Courses. Required forms and procedures will be mailed in the spring and fall of the program entry year. Additional detailed information is available from the Program Coordinator, Emergency Medical Technology, 734-462-4400, extension 6055, located at the Radcliff Center, Room RC 375. An authorization to register is only issued upon completion of the following requirements:

- ☐ **Criminal History Check Clearance**
- ☐ **Medical Clearance/Drug Screen**
- ☐ **Maintain a cumulative grade point average of 2.0 or better**
- ☐ **Required Immunizations**
  - Two **MMR** vaccinations (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) – one as a child – one as an adult or Titer showing immunity for ALL of the above.
  - **Hepatitis B** vaccination or Titer – (series must be started prior to clinical), or a signed Vaccination Declination Form.
  - **TB Test** – TB test expires after 12 months. The student's TB test cannot expire before the end of class and/or when clinicals will be completed.
  - **Chicken Pox** – 2 Varicella vaccinations given 1 month apart and/or a laboratory Titer verifying immunity. NOTE: we are no long accepting history of chicken pox as evidence of immunity.
- ☐ **Successful completion of EMT 115 and National Registry Certification and/or State of Michigan EMT Basic License prior to the start of clinical.**
