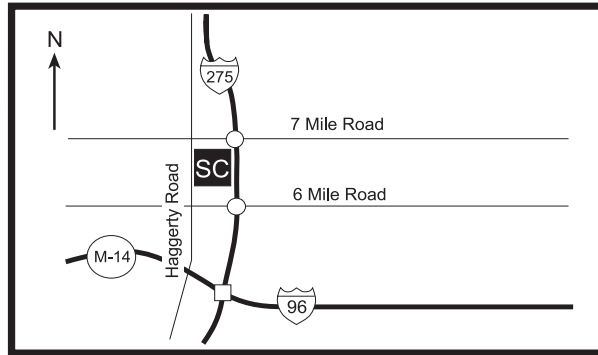

- You must be admitted to Schoolcraft College and also complete the Career Assessment Inventory at Schoolcraft College Career and Transfer Center.

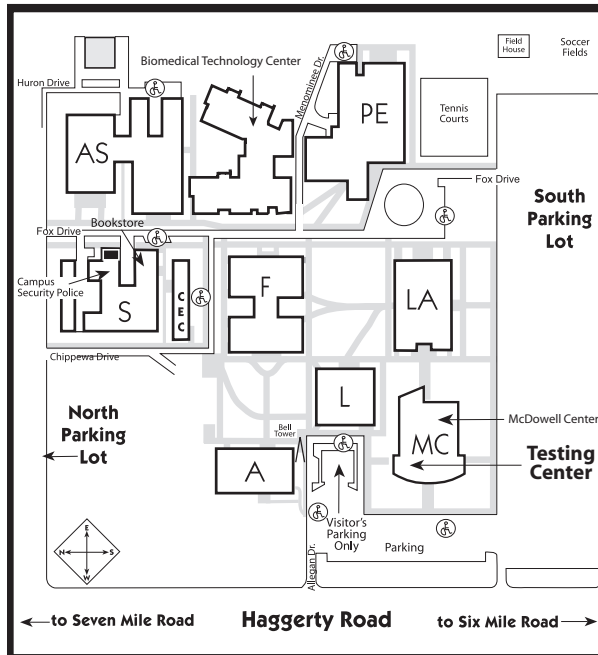
Scholarship recipients receive \$500 for tuition, fees, books and supplies to be used within the academic year it is awarded.

WHEN REGISTERING

Please bring the following with you to register:

- A government-issued, photo ID such as a driver's license, passport or state ID.
- Your social security number
- Your email address
- Payment for the exam: \$150 for first-time testing, cash, credit, or check

Registration takes approximately one (1) hour and includes creating a user name and password and filling out required forms.

GED TEST REGISTRATION FEE

GED Test Registration: **\$150**

Exam Retake Fee: **\$30 per subject**

Fees must be submitted with Registration Form. Tests may be rescheduled once without additional payment. A rescheduling fee of \$10 will apply thereafter.

Test fees are nonrefundable and are subject to change.

THE GED PROGRAM

The GED Program is a series of five tests that measures knowledge and skills typically learned during high school.

■ DAY 1

Language Arts, Writing Skills.....Two Hours
(Parts I & II)

Mathematics

Part 1 (calculator) 45 min.

Part 2 (no calculator) 45 min.

Casio fx 260 Solar Calculator is supplied for the Mathematics Test, Part 1.

■ DAY 2

Science..... One Hour, 20 min.

Social Studies One Hour, 10 min.

Reading Information Test..... One Hour, 5 min.

REQUIREMENTS

- Government photo identification verifying age and signature is required for admission to the test session.
- Social Security Number
- Individuals who are at least 16 years of age and have been out of a regular school program for one calendar year may be tested. Please contact the Testing Center at 734-462-4806 for information regarding when the calendar year may be waived for testing.

ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATE

- The passing standard score must be a minimum of **410 on each** of the five tests.
- Candidates must attain an average standard score of **450 for all five tests**.
- Candidates must be 18 years old and their high school class must have graduated to be eligible for a GED certificate.

GED testing accommodations are available for eligible individuals with physical or learning disabilities.
