Supported by a \$4.9 million grant from the Department of Labor, Macomb Community College is developing and providing training to better position unemployed workers, under-employed workers, dislocated workers and veterans for jobs in the defense sector in southeast Michigan. Macomb Community College has agreements with community colleges and other educational institutions, including Schoolcraft College, in Southeast Michigan to promote training within this grant. There are many training opportunities in development, so it is important to check the above webpage frequently to identify potential training opportunities that match your circumstances.

 - The MS Project 2010: An Introduction class will be offered Winter 2012 on Tuesday evenings, 6:30-8:30 p.m. The class begins March 13th and runs for 5 weeks.
