



Dr. Samuel T. Orton and Anna Gillingham introduced the concept of multi-sensory education in the 1930s to help tutor individuals with dyslexia, but this method has been found to benefit all learners. The Institute for Multi-Sensory Education (IMSE) updated and customized the Orton-Gillingham concept for teachers. This face-to-face, hands-on technique works with any current reading program and can be an additional tool to incorporate into literacy instruction for general and special needs students. In IMSE training sessions, participants will learn: the 3-part drill (visual, auditory, kinesthetic), syllabication patterns for decoding and encoding, guidelines for weekly lesson plans, assessment, reciprocal teaching method, fluency, and multi-sensory techniques for sight words. They will learn how to incorporate into daily lessons the five essential reading program components: phonemic awareness, phonics, vocabulary development, and fluency and comprehension strategies. Teachers will secure an understanding of the revised Orton-Gillingham based methodology, assessment and higher level skills, and the tools to implement this program into existing curriculum. Basic Rider Course

Designed for someone who has minimal experience operating a motorcycle, this course focuses on the development of basic riding skills: turning, shifting and braking. You will receive approximately 16 hours of instruction, five (5) in the classroom and 11 on the range. Training bikes will be provided. This course is offered in different formats: one (1) weekend, two (2) weekend, weekday and weeknight. The weekday, weeknight or two (2) weekend courses are recommended for novice riders. Successful completion allows a student to waive the Secretary of State riding skills test.

Three-Wheel Basic Rider Course

If you have minimal experience or are unlicensed operating a three-wheel motorcycle, this course is for you. Develop your basic riding skills as you learn proper turning, shifting and braking. You have approximately 12 hours of instruction in one (1) weekend; four (4) in the classroom and eight (8) on the range. Each student must provide their own three-wheel motorcycle. Sharing is not allowed. The cycle must be titled, properly registered, and display a valid license plate. Each student must provide proof of insurance and the bike must pass a safety inspection. Successful completion allows a student to waive the Secretary of State riding skills test.

Returning Rider Basic Rider Course

A one day course designed for the experienced but unlicensed rider to become licensed and legal. Many experienced, licensed riders use this course as a refresher and skills tune up. Topics include: braking, counter steering, turning, speed judgment, and other techniques necessary for the experienced rider to operate a motorcycle skillfully and safely. Each student must provide their own motorcycle. Scooters will be allowed in this class. Sharing is not allowed. The cycle must be titled, properly registered, and display a valid license plate. Each student must provide proof of insurance and the bike must pass a safety inspection. Successful completion allows a student to waive the Secretary of State riding skills test.



Advanced Rider Course

This one day course is designed for licensed, experienced riders who have a cycle endorsement to enhance their basic skills and help with personal risk assessment. Interactive classroom activities to improve perception and hazard awareness are combined with range exercises which enhance both basic skills and crash avoidance skills. You will learn to improve braking and corner finesse. It is the public version of the Military Sport Bike Rider Course. Each student must provide their own motorcycle. Sharing is not allowed. The cycle must be titled, properly registered, and display a valid license plate. Each student must provide proof of insurance and the bike must pass a safety inspection.

- \$25 non-refundable & non-transferable class fee for all motorcycle safety classes.
- You must be present for the entire class; students arriving late by 5 minutes or more for the first class session will not be allowed in the class, and no refund will be given.
- You must provide protective clothing/gear for all motorcycle classes—no sharing! Visit our Web site for more details on required clothing/gear.
- · Students under the age of 18 are allowed to take the Basic Rider, 3-Wheel Basic Rider, or Returning Rider Basic Rider Courses starting at age 15 if they have a valid driver's license. This includes those that hold a Level 1 Graduated Driver License. A parent or guardian must accompany the student to the first class meeting; parent signatures are required on some documents.

Online Class Information



Continuing Education and Professional Development offers a great alternative to traditional classes held here on campus. You can update your skills, discover a new talent or chart a career path at your own pace and convenience—we bring the classroom right to you, wherever you may be.

How do online classes work?

Each class consists of twelve lessons that are made available to you over a specific six week period. The first lesson is released after 4 a.m. on the first Wednesday of class; subsequent lessons are released on Fridays and Wednesdays. You do not need to be present when the lesson is released, but you must complete each lesson within two weeks of its release. The lessons are supplemented by interactive quizzes, assignments, tutorials, and online discussion areas available via the Web.

What classes are available?

Our online classes are notated throughout this schedule with the words "Online" next to the class title. You can also visit www.ed2go.com/school-craft for all of our general classes. Teachers interested in our teacher recertification classes should go to www.ed2go.com/sceducator.

What do I need to take an online class?

All you need is Internet access; Microsoft Internet Explorer or Mozilla Firefox Web browser; familiarity with the Internet; email; and a computer. Additional software requirements, if any, will be noted in the class description. Some classes are not compatible with Macintosh computers.

How do I register?
