This includes maintaining network hardware and software, analyzing problems, and monitoring networks to ensure availability to system users. Specialists provide technical assistance, support, and advice to customers and other system users.

What Characteristics Do I Need To Work In This Field?

A technical mind and trouble-shooting ability are the key skills involved in networking. You also need to be able to communicate, multi-task, and work quickly and competently under pressure.

Where Could I Find a Job?

Virtually every work environment needs networking expertise, including professional offices, small businesses, government, and large corporations.

Employment opportunities for Systems Administrators are expected to grow faster than average for all occupations through the year 2020. Opportunities for Computer Support Specialists are expected to grow as fast as the average.
