Coding Specialist

What does a Coding Specialist do?

A Coding Specialist/Coder is an individual who reviews and analyzes health records to identify the diagnoses and procedures for each time a patient seeks healthcare advice. The Coding Specialist is responsible for translating diagnostic and procedural medical terminology phrases into coded form.

Where does a Coding Specialist work?

Coding Specialists work in hospital departments such as health information services, quality management, professional fee services, radiology, emergency room, outpatient/ambulatory surgery, ancillary services and specialty physician clinics, insurance companies, government agencies and health maintenance organizations.

Employment Outlook

Employment opportunities for the Coding Specialist is expected to grow faster than the average for all occupations through the year 2012.


