Information and Application Packet 2022-23

Program Description

The Occupational Therapy Assistant program provides the knowledge and skills that will enable students to enter the workforce in a variety of healthcare and community settings. The didactic and clinical learning experiences require full-time participation of approximately 40 hours per week each week throughout the program. This program is designed as a full-time cohort program so students will work through their OTA professional courses and clinical experiences in a sequential manner with a set group of students. Students are encouraged to not have an additional job outside of their OTA program studies.

The program is based at the facilities located at the Schoolcraft College Livonia Main campus, and includes state-of-the-art classroom and clinical training resources designed to promote an exceptional educational experience.

Admission to the OTA program occurs once per year, at the beginning of the fall semester, and is a competitive process. Admission decisions will be made in the spring/summer prior to the start of the program, and acceptance must be made prior to the deadline indicated in the offer. Students must satisfactorily complete the pre-requisite courses and meet other admission requirements in order to apply to this restricted enrollment program. If a student is finishing final prerequisite courses during the application period, an application submitted by the deadline will be accepted. Students who are conditionally accepted into the program must complete all program requirements by the designated date. Students who do not complete the final admission requirements by scheduled academic deadlines will have their application deferred to another admission year. Students may only defer one time without having to repeat the application process. This program has preadmission and admission requirements that are reviewed annually. Students will be required to furnish and maintain uniforms and other supplies as required by the department and clinical facilities.

Successful completion of the program requirements qualifies the student to take the national credential examination offered by the National Board for Certification in Occupational Therapy (NBCOT). Satisfactory completion of this exam enables the students to become a Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant (COTA). Most states, including Michigan, require licensure in order to practice as an Occupational Therapy Assistant. In Michigan, this licensure is managed by the state Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA).

Application Requirements

The Occupational Therapy Assistant Program requires an application (attached to the end of this packet). To be admitted to the program you must complete the following.

Applicants may be accepted into the Occupational Therapy Assistant program ONLY if they have applied and completed all the requirements to the program by the end of the day on JULY 1, 2023.

2. Transcripts	It is recommended you request official undergraduate transcripts from <u>all</u> colleges and universities previously attended. Transcripts must be sent directly from the issuing college or university to Schoolcraft College. To confirm that transcripts have been received, contact the Answer Center at 734-462-4426.

3. Academic Advising and Assessment	This program requires minimum assessment levels or course work in the areas of math, reading, and writing. You need to meet with an academic advisor to develop an academic plan. The advisor can determine if an assessment test is necessary and if foundation courses are needed. Students with prior college level work or a degree may be exempt from placement testing. Students who have submitted SAT or ACT scores that are less than three years old to the Admissions and Welcome Center may also be exempt from assessment testing. Complete HIT 100 or HIT 104 – Medical Terminology or equivalent with a grade of 2.0/C or higher.
5. Cumulative GPA	Attain a cumulative grade point average of $2.5/C+$ or higher in all program pre-requisite courses.
6. Apply to Occupational Therapy Assistant Program	Meet with your Academic Advisor to complete the attached Occupational Therapy Assistant Restricted Enrollment forms.
7. Observation Form	Complete 10 hours of clinical Occupational Therapy observation in two different settings or with two different populations. Complete the attached observation form for each setting or population and have it signed by the OT Clinician on duty during your observation.
8. Meet with Program Director	Once all application documents have been received, you will be contacted by the OTA Program Director to arrange a time to meet.

Declination of immunizations may prevent student from completing clinical experiences required for the program.

- Two MMR vaccinations (Measles, Mumps, Rubella) one as a child one as an adult or Titer showing immunity for ALL of the above.
- Hepatitis B vaccination or Titer (series must be started prior to clinical) or a signed Vaccination Declination Form.
- Flu Shot *must have annual vaccination*.
- Tetanus/Diphtheria/Pertussis (TDAP) must have received a TDAP within the past 7 years.
- Two-step TB Test TB test expires after 12 months. The student's TB test cannot expire before the end of class and/or when clinical will be completed.
- Chicken Pox 2 Varicella vaccinations given 1 month apart and/or a laboratory Titer verifying immunity. NOTE: we are no longer accepting history of chicken pox as evidence of immunity.
- Covid-19 Vaccination or other vaccinations as required by federal, state, or clinical agency guidelines. NOTE: Subject to permitted clinical site medical/religious exemptions.
