#### Information and Application Packet 2022-2023

#### **PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

The Nursing Career Ladder Curriculum (NCLC) offers options for practical nursing (PN) and registered nursing associate degree in applied sciences (RN-AAS) education. Students are admitted into the associate degree program and are eligible to apply for licensure as a licensed practical nurse (LPN) following successful completion of the PN program requirements at the end of the first academic year. Students, who continue and successfully complete the AAS program, are eligible to apply for licensure as a registered nurse (RN). Michigan licensed practical nurses (LPNs) may apply for advanced placement into the second year of the RN-AAS program.

The Nursing Career Ladder Curriculum (NCLC) is rigorous and challenging. It requires a high level of student commitment and mastery of content in many academic areas. Important information about the Nursing Career Ladder Curriculum:

- Nursing courses are offered during the day/afternoon at the Livonia campus. First year courses are scheduled throughout the year with 7-week courses with the exception of the nursing pharmacology course, which is a 12-week course. The optional PN course at the end of the first year of the nursing program is available during a 4-week summer session (the PN course is optional for RN students). To complete the RN-AAS degree, the second-year courses are scheduled into four 7-week sessions.
- In addition to course theory, laboratory and clinical practice are required. Computer use and computerized testing are required for each course. Students will need to have a computer device for home and on campus use that meets the requirements as provided at the time of entry. Courses typically include one day of theory with two days of clinical. Clinical sessions are offered on day or afternoon shifts with potential weekend rotations. The clinical days may not be sequential days of the week and will vary based on clinical site availability. Students must meet all requirements as designated by the department, college, and clinical agencies.
- Nursing courses must be taken in sequence or assigned rotation. A minimum grade of 80% in each nursing course and satisfactory clinical
  performance is required for progression to the next nursing course.

The PN and RN-AAS programs are approved by the Michigan Board of Nursing and have received additional national Accreditation Commission for Education in Nursing (ACEN). For more information on MI-Board of Nursing approval and licensure please contact:

Completion of program requirements provides students with eligibility to take the NCLEX-RN or NCLEX-PN exams. - 5. Complete one of the following math courses: MATH102, 111, 113, or higher with a minimum of 2.0/C
- 6. Achieve minimum scores on TEAS entrance exam and request ATI send official scores to Schoolcraft College
- 7. Attain a 2.5/C+ or better cumulative grade point average

Transcripts must be sent directly from the issuing college or university to Schoolcraft College Records Office. 3. Advising	The nursing program requires minimum assessment levels of course work in the areas of math, reading, and writing. Students should meet with an academic advisor to develop an academic plan. Students with prior college level work or a degree may be exempt from general college placement testing. Students who have submitted ACT or SAT scores that are less than three years old to the Records Office may also be exempt from assessment testing. Contact the Academic Advising Center at 734-462-4429 to make an appointment to discuss an academic plan and preparation for the TEAS (nursing entrance) exam.

	<ul> <li>Minimum TEAS Exam scores required are: Composite: 60% (Adjusted Individual Total Score), 68% Reading, 60% English, 60% Math, 50% Science.</li> </ul>
	Achieve the required minimum scores on the <u>ONLINE</u> TEAS Exam (Test of Essential Academic Skills) within two attempts. Students may take the TEAS exam a maximum of 2 times within a 12-month period. The highest score for each section of the two attempts will be accepted. Ex: Students may not take a third attempt until the first test date attempt expires. The maximum number of attempts on the TEAS exam is four (4) attempts overall. Students must complete all sections of the TEAS Exam with maximum effort on each attempt for scores to be accepted and composite score must still be 60% or higher.
	TEAS online exam scores are accepted from other institutions (until September 1, 2022) if the student has ATI send the official test results to Schoolcraft College. Written test exam scores are not accepted as all nursing courses utilize computerized testing. As of September 1, 2022, all TEAS testing will need to be taken in person at the Schoolcraft College Testing Center.
	Students who may need academic testing accommodations should meet with the Disability Support Services Office (734-462-4330) prior to taking the TEAS exam to determine potential accommodations.
	The Schoolcraft College Personal and Professional Learning Department has a preparation course available to assist with test success <u>http://www.schoolcraft.edu/PPL</u> and the ATI website also has study materials and practice exams available. The Schoolcraft College Learning Support Services department also provides free personalized TEAS prep plans for success through one-on-one and group formats. 	TEAS Exam attempts at Schoolcraft College must be scheduled in advance. Fees paid are non-refundable and non-transferrable. Students needing to change testing dates will need to pay the full fee. 8. Apply to the NCLC	The Nursing Career Ladder Curriculum Program (NCLC) application is attached to the end of this packet (Attachment A). Complete the student portion of the application and meet with an academic advisor for academic planning and to sign off on the application. The academic advisor will submit the application packet to the Admissions and Welcome Center. Applications are reviewed on a continual basis and students will receive an acceptance letter via email from the Admissions Department which states the year and cohort the student will be able to start the nursing program. Students who do not respond to correspondence by deadlines will be cancelled by the Admissions Department.
	All required prerequisites must be completed (with final course grade on transcript) prior to submitting application.

## Acceptance to the NCLC and prior to starting the Nursing Program

- The order of acceptance of qualified applicants will be based on the date the College receives a **valid** application. An application is **valid** only if **all** of the requirements listed in this document have been met.
- Any incomplete applications received from a student will be returned. Applications may be resubmitted when all of the requirements have been met.
- In the event more than one qualified student applies on the same day, the applications will be ordered based on highest cumulative grade point average in the prerequisite/supportive courses.

- Accepted students will be emailed an information packet from the nursing department to Schoolcraft College email only. Information will be emailed approximately two months prior to the start semester. Students are responsible for maintaining current contact information for all college communications. Students should get their college email forwarded to their primary email so as not to miss any communications.
- Students may defer their admission only one time, otherwise, the student will need to reapply and meet the application requirements at that time.
- Students who do not meet nursing department deadlines, or have been accepted to the program and then are "no call, no show" to start the program, will be cancelled and not eligible to reapply to the program in the future.
- After August 1 for fall start cohorts, and after October 1 for winter start cohorts, preference will be given for students to be pulled up to spots vacated, with students who have completed the NURS 104 Nursing Pharmacology course or the NATP 115 Nursing Assistant Course OR are currently enrolled in either course and have current passing status.

	To provide students an opportunity to develop the skills necessary for the demanding field of nursing education, the College offers a nursing specific section of COLLS 130 (Applied Learning Theory for Nursing Majors).		
11. Optional COLLS 130 Course	This course provides instruction on reading efficiency and speed techniques, learning/study strategies, and critical thinking/test taking skills using nursing materials and concepts. Students can contact Academic Advising at 734-462-4429 for more information.		
12. Hepatitis B Vaccine	Students who do not have the Hepatitis B vaccine three shot series already completed, should begin the series while waiting to start the nursing program.		
13. CPR Course for Healthcare Professionals	Students should wait to complete an American Heart Association Basic Life Support course for Professional Healthcare Providers until approximately 2 months prior to starting the nursing program. Students need to complete a course that includes an in-person demonstration of the performance skills (adult, child, infant and AED use). 100% online courses are not accepted.		
14. Other Nursing Program	Students will be emailed additional information about Orientation sessions and other health/clinical/program requirements

#### **REQUIREMENTS PRIOR TO NCLC PROGRAM REGISTRATION ADN BEGINNING THE NCLC**

(Requirements subject to change. Students will be sent emails with requirements to Schoolcraft College emails only.)

- Participate in a mandatory NCLC Student Orientation session.
  - Schedule and meet with the Nursing Resource Instructor for a personal interview to discuss educational goals, learning techniques/strategies, and recommendations for success in the program by nursing department deadline dates.
  - Complete all health/clinical placement requirements and provide documentation including a health questionnaire/physical exam (dated within the last 12 months from the fall start of the nursing program), TB testing, immunization records including Measles, Mumps, Rubella (MMR), Tetanus, diphtheria, Pertussis (TdaP), Varicella (chicken pox), Hepatitis B, flu vaccine (in season), COVID vaccine, a negative urine drug screen on first attempt (marijuana use is still prohibited), and pass a criminal background check by nursing office deadline dates provided in the emailed packet. Drug screens may need to be repeated throughout the program as required by clinical agencies. Students will also need to meet any other future health/clinical/agency requirements as specified by the agencies.

**6.** NURSING ADMISSIONS TEAS EXAM Achieve the required minimum scores on the <u>online</u> TEAS Exam (Test of Essential Academic Skills) within two attempts per 12 months. Highest scores in each section on the two attempts will be accepted. Maximum number of overall attempts allowed is four (4) attempts. Ex: A third attempt may not be taken until the first attempt expires.

Exam scores are accepted from other institutions until September 1, 2022. After this date all TEAS testing needs to be taken at the Schoolcraft College Testing Center. Exam scores prior to the September date must be sent from ATI to Schoolcraft College.
