

Kids on Campus Culinary Camp Behavior Contract

Thank you for signing up for a Kids on Campus culinary camp. KOC culinary camps are taught by Certified Master Chefs. These camps are intensive and require a weeklong dedication to the craft. Our hope is that student will leave camp with an important life skill and a passion for culinary arts.

The camps are held in professional, working kitchens. For the health and safety of everyone, it is very important that student follow behavioral expectations, directions from the chefs and proper sanitation rules in the kitchens. Below are the behavior expectations that are required:

- Students will follow proper sanitation processes as demonstrated by chefs and sous chefs.
- Students will follow directions from the chefs and sous chefs.
- Student will use all equipment and supplies appropriately and for their intended purposes only.
- Cell phones may not be used while working in the kitchen.
- Student will wear comfortable, closed toe shoes and be prepared to stand for the majority of the camp day.
- Students must bring a tool kit to class **each day** containing the following: a paring and chef knife, peeler, heat proof spatula and measuring spoons.
- Students should wear long pants. Long hair should be tied back.
- Bullying of any kind will not be tolerated. Students will be respectful at all times to fellow classmates and all staff.
- Students will be grouped in sets of three or four. Although it will not always be possible, the chefs will attempt to group friends together. Groups will not be changed after the first day of camp.
- Students will be active participants in the camp activities; failure of even one child to participate negatively impacts their group and the entire camp.

Students Rights:

- I have the right to be in a safe and supportive environment, free from discrimination, harassment or bigotry.
- I have the right to know what appropriate behavior is and what behaviors may result in disciplinary actions.

Failure to abide by this behavioral contract will result in disciplinary action which may include dismissal from the camp.
