



# 2020 REGIONAL SCHEDULE

## **BASIC RIDERCOURSE (BRC) - WEB ENHANCED | BEGINNING RIDERS | E |**

This course is designed for someone who has little or no experience operating a motorcycle, and it focuses on the development of basic riding skills: clutch and throttle coordination, straight-line riding, braking, turning, and shifting. **Training motorcycles are provided.** Privately owned motorcycles are **NOT** permitted. This is a **path-to-Endorsement** course: successful completion allows a student to waive the written knowledge test and riding-skills test at the Secretary of State.

Instruction consists of approximately 18 total hours – 3 hours of online preparation to be completed prior to your class start date, 5 hours of classroom instruction, and 10 hours of hands-on training.

**Weekend BRC students need to be available, but not necessarily on-site, for all of Saturday and Sunday.** Students are placed into groups during classroom instruction on Friday; those in *Group A* will ride in the morning (8am-1pm), and those in *Group B* will ride in the afternoon (1pm-6pm). While we do our best to accommodate requests, please keep in mind that we cannot guarantee placement into either specified group. Please reserve any such discussions for your instructor on Friday.

### **\*Prerequisites**

- Ability to ride a bicycle.
- Must have a valid email address on file with the community college at which you registered. Must complete the online eCourse prior to your class start date and bring the completion certificate to the first class session. The link to the eCourse will be distributed via email at least one week prior to the start date of your class. If you have not received an email by this time, you must contact the community college at which you registered.

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## **BASIC RIDERCOURSE 2 (BRC2) | EXPERIENCED RIDERS | E |**

This course is designed mainly for experienced but unendorsed motorcyclists; however, endorsed motorcyclists also use this course to refresh their skills. Topics include: braking, countersteering, turning, speed judgment, and other techniques necessary for the experienced rider to operate a motorcycle skillfully and safely. **Students must provide their own motorcycle.** Mopeds are welcome. Three-wheeled motorcycles are **NOT** permitted. Sharing is **NOT** permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; and it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, and the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection. This is a **path-to-Endorsement** course: successful completion allows a student to waive the written knowledge test and riding-skills test at the Secretary of State.

### **Prerequisites**

- Prior motorcycling experience.
- Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, and insured.

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## **ADVANCED RIDERCOURSE (ARC) | EXPERIENCED, ENDORSED RIDERS |**

This course is designed for experienced, endorsed motorcyclists to enhance their basic skills and help with personal risk assessment. Interactive classroom activities to improve perception and hazard awareness are combined with range exercises that enhance both basic skills and crash-avoidance skills. You will also learn how to improve braking and cornering finesse. This is the public version of the Military SportBike RiderCourse. **Students must provide their own motorcycle.** Mopeds are **NOT** permitted. Three-wheeled motorcycles are **NOT** permitted. Sharing is **NOT** permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; and it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, and the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection.

### **Prerequisites**

- Motorcycle endorsement.
- Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, and insured.
- Considerable street-riding miles.

**Basic RiderCourse 2 (BRC2) | Experienced Riders | One Day:** Saturday or Sunday, 8am-6pm.

**Advanced RiderCourse (ARC) | Experienced, Endorsed Riders | One Day:** Saturday or Sunday, 9am-6pm.

**Advanced RiderCourse (ARC) | Experienced, Endorsed Riders | Weeknight:** Two-day course. Tuesday and Wednesday, 5pm-10pm.

**Advanced RiderCourse (ARC) | Experienced, Endorsed Riders | Skill Practice:** Saturday or Sunday, 9am-2:30pm.

**PLEASE NOTE:** *Participants must be available to attend all scheduled times. You must be on time or you may be denied admission.*

### **STUDENTS MUST PROVIDE THEIR OWN SUPPLIES AND PROTECTIVE RIDING GEAR INCLUDING:**

DOT-certified motorcycle helmet; long-sleeved jacket or heavy shirt; heavy-duty long pants; eye protection – goggles or glasses (required even with a face shield); full-finger gloves; boots – must cover ankle and have a hard sole (high-top tennis shoes and high heels are not permitted); pen or pencil; and rain or cold weather gear, as needed.

*Students under the age of 18 are allowed to take the Basic RiderCourse or Basic RiderCourse 2 starting at age 15 if they have a graduated driver license. A parent or legal guardian must accompany the student on the first day of class, and his or her signatures will be required for the course waiver.*

**THE NON-REFUNDABLE COURSE FEE FOR EACH CLASS IS \$50.00**
