## What is the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA)?

As a Schoolcraft College student, and with the help of your academic advisor or counselor, you select general education courses from the list below. When you transfer out to a MTA-receiving four-year college or university, your lower-level general education requirements should be satisfied! All grades must be 2.0 or above in order for the courses to transfer.
