



Use of Force Instructor Course

This 8-hour course incorporates lecture, video analysis, and classroom discussion. The curriculum focuses on a wide-range of legalities pertinent to understanding Use-of-Force and has been designed to cover some of the most critical, contentious, and controversial aspects of this topic.

Course modules include and examine:

- Instructor Image, Course Preparation & Presentation
- Reasonable Application of Force and Case Law
- Aspects of Force for Corrections & Security Personnel
- Identifying Pre-Assault Behavior
- Use-of-Force Models and Usage
- Understanding Video Evidence
- Medical Implications of Use-of-Force
- Use-of-Force Policy Development
- Use-of-Force Report Writing
- De-Escalation & Scene Co-Management
- Assessing Use-of-Force Evidence & Incidents

Upon certification, participants will possess the knowledge and be provided with course material to conduct a relevant classroom presentation to their officers regarding Use of Force.

This course is taught by law enforcement personnel who understand police Use-of-Force and have been recognized as subject matter experts. These instructors have taught, utilized, and testified at all levels related to this topic and will aid in setting attendees on a path for becoming experts for their agency. Certification will be active for three years.
