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

Each year the Global Citizenship Award is presented to a SC student who participates in the community at a range of levels from the local to the global and acts to make the world a more equitable and sustainable place. In addition to a certificate, the student receives a \$500.00 academic scholarship. More recently, to allow sustainability of the award in future years, SC Professors

Anna and Neal Maheshwari generously created a fund within the SC Foundation to fund this award in perpetuity.

The 2025 Global Citizenship Award winner Tiffany Cabrera Armas was nominated by numerous faculty members and was chosen unanimously by the selection award committee. Tiffany is originally from Peru and chose to study in Michigan as a member of the Honor College at Schoolcraft. Tiffany was a leader on campus and completed the two-year program in just a year!

In an application essay, Tiffany discussed her thoughts about community: "Leadership has always been a driving force in my life, shaping my personal growth and guiding my contributions to my community. From an early age growing up in Peru, I have been eager to speak up, advocate for others, and create positive change. This passion has led me to take on leadership roles in various capacities, from high school to my current journey at Schoolcraft College, where I continue to develop my skills and make a meaningful impact."

Professor Errin Stegich articulated the thoughts and feelings of faculty when she said: "Tiffany a.k.a. "Lulu," is a bright and spirited young lady and I am thrilled that you have chosen her. Past Globaleyezer Speaker Dr. Raj Maheshwari Distinguished Alumni Award



SCII members were so proud to hear the words of Dr. Raj Maheshwari as he spoke to graduating students at the 60th Annual Commencement where he was honored with a Distinguished Alumni Award.

You may recognize Raj as a past Schoolcraft student and as a frequent International Institute Globaleyezer speaker who continues to support the College and in particular our global initiatives on campus.

Raj addressed the audience and talked about the impact Schoolcraft College faculty, staff, and the entire community had in shaping him into the person he is today. Raj attended University of Cincinnati's medical program, did his residency in Anesthesiology at Royal Oak Beaumont Hospital, and fellowship in Pediatric Anesthesiology at Johns Hopkins in Baltimore. He currently practices at Advent Hospital in Tampa, Florida but continues to find time to support Schoolcraft College.

Raj stressed with the graduates the importance of family and community. He highlighted the fact that even though they are non-traditional students, nothing about them is traditional. He applauded their grit, hard-work resilience, tenacity

in working for a degree while working one or more jobs, and taking care of their families.

He stressed that the pursuit and not the ending is important, to be lifelong learners, and chase happiness. Most importantly find what you are good at and what the world needs, and get paid for it while embracing humility. *Finally, the most important assets in your lives are your family, friends, teachers, and your community.*

Midwest Institute Conference



On March 28th-29th, Professors Helen Ditouras (English) and Kristin Fruth (Biology) travelled to Lorain County Community College in Ohio to attend the 31st annual Conference of the Midwest Institute for International/Intercultural Education (MIIIE). During the conference, Secretary of the Board, Helen Ditouras, presented updates on curriculum modules centered on Southeast Asia funded by a grant from Michigan State. Dr. Colleen Pilgrim (Psychology)

and Dr. Anna Maheshwari (English) both developed curriculum for Schoolcraft College students focused on Cambodia and Vietnam, respectively. Dr. Pilgrim's work reflected her experiences in Cambodia as a recipient of the CAORC funding she received to travel overseas last year.

In addition to Schoolcraft's participation at the MIIIE conference, other engaging presentations highlighted topics such as teaching philosophy students about the limitations of the Golden Rule in an international context, understanding social media's impact on English Language Acculturation, global pop culture and how it can foster belonging in community colleges, education in Türkiye and how the study of art and academics can reduce misconceptions of the Middle East, among many other interesting presentations.
