

Basic RiderCourse (BRC) - Web Enhanced | Beginning Riders

This course is designed for someone who has little or no experience operating a motorcycle, and it focuses on the development of basic riding skills: clutch and throttle coordination, straight-line riding, braking, turning, and shifting. **Training motorcycles are provided.** Privately owned motorcycles are **NOT** permitted. The course also provides a fast track to *motorcycle endorsement* (CY); successful completion results in a certificate that waives the written knowledge test and riding-skill test, which would otherwise be administered by the Secretary of State and a third-party testing agency, respectively.

Instruction consists of approximately 17 total hours – 5 hours of online preparation to be completed prior to your class start date and 12 hours of hands-on training, activities, evaluation, and testing. *Standard Weekend* students need to be available, but not necessarily on-site, for all of Saturday and Sunday. Students are placed into groups on Friday; Group A rides in the morning, and Group B rides in the afternoon. Please reserve any requests for your instructor on Friday.

Prerequisites

• Ability to ride a bicycle.

• Valid email address on file with the College. Must complete the online eCourse prior to your class start date and bring the completion certificate to the first class session. The link to the eCourse will be distributed by the College via email at least one week prior to the start date of your class. If you have not received an email by this time, you must contact the PPL office at (734) 462-4448.

MSF ePACKAGE 1 eCOURSE INFORMATION:

The MSF ePackage 1 eCourse (online component) is a required pre-course assignment for all Basic RiderCourses (BRC) - Web Enhanced. Information pertaining to the eCourse will be emailed to all students approximately 1-2 weeks prior to the class start date. This email will include:

• The registration link for the eCourse

· Instructions for enrolling in the eCourse

• Instructions for accessing and completing the eCourse

To ensure you receive the eCourse information, you must provide a valid email address during registration with the College. If you do not receive the email with the eCourse instructions at least one week before your class begins, you must contact the office of Personal & Professional Learning at (734) 462-4448 or motorcycle@schoolcraft.edu.

The eCourse MUST be completed prior to the start of your class and the completion certificate must be shown to your RiderCoach upon arrival.

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY **2023 SCHOOLCRAFT SCHEDULE**

Basic RiderCourse 2 (BRC2) | Experienced Riders

This course is designed mainly for experienced but unendorsed motorcyclists; however, endorsed motorcyclists also use this course to refresh their skills. Topics include: braking, countersteering, turning, speed judgment, and other techniques necessary for the experienced rider to operate a motorcycle skillfully and safely. Students must provide their own motorcycle. Mopeds are welcome. Three-wheeled motorcycles are NOT permitted. Sharing is NOT permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; and it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, and the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection. The course also provides a fast track to motorcycle endorsement (CY); successful completion results in a certificate that waives the written knowledge test and riding-skill test, which would otherwise be administered by the Secretary of State and a third-party testing agency, respectively.

Prerequisites

- Prior motorcycling experience.
- Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, and insured.
- Valid email address on file with the College.

Advanced RiderCourse (ARC) | Experienced, Endorsed Riders

This course is designed for experienced, endorsed motorcyclists to enhance their basic skills and help with personal risk assessment. Interactive classroom activities to improve perception and hazard awareness are combined with range exercises that enhance both basic skills and crash-avoidance skills. You will also learn how to improve braking and cornering finesse. This is the public version of the Military SportBike RiderCourse. Students must provide their own motorcycle. Mopeds are NOT permitted. Three-wheeled motorcycles are NOT permitted. Sharing is NOT permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; and it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, and the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection.

Prerequisites

• Motorcycle endorsement.

• Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, and insured.

· Considerable street-riding miles.

AGE REQUIREMENTS: Students aged 15-17 are permitted to take the Basic RiderCourse (BRC) or Basic RiderCourse 2 (BRC2) if they have a graduated driver's license; however, a parent or legal guardian must accompany them on the first day of class to sign the course waiver.

STUDENTS MUST PROVIDE THEIR OWN SUPPLIES AND PROTECTIVE RIDING GEAR INCLUDING: Full-fingered gloves

- Driver's license
 - Pen or pencil
- DOT-compliant motorcycle helmet
- Eye protection (goggles or glasses)
- Long-sleeved jacket or heavy shirt
- Heavy-duty long pants
- Boots that cover the ankle and have a hard sole •
- . Rain and cold weather gear, as needed
 - Plenty of water, a packed lunch, and lots of snacks
