

MOTORCYCLE SAFETY 2025 REGIONAL SCHEDULE

BASIC RIDERCOURSE (BRC) - WEB ENHANCED | BEGINNING RIDERS

This course is designed for someone who has little or no experience operating a motorcycle, focused on the development of basic riding skills: clutch and throttle coordination, straight-line riding, braking, turning, & shifting. **Training motorcycles are provided.** Privately owned motorcycles are **NOT** permitted. The course also provides a fast track to *motorcycle endorsement* (CY); successful completion results in a certificate that waives the written knowledge test & riding-skill test, which would otherwise be administered by the Secretary of State & a third-party testing agency, respectively.

Instruction consists of approximately 17 total hours – 5 hours of an online *eCourse to be completed prior to your class start date & 12 hours of handson training, activities, evaluation, and testing.

Standard Weekend students need to be available, but not necessarily on-site, for all of Saturday & Sunday. Students are placed into groups after classroom instruction on Friday; Group A will ride in the morning, & Group B will ride in the afternoon. While we do our best to accommodate student schedules, we cannot guarantee placement into either specified group. Please reserve any requests for your instructor on Friday after class.

*Must complete the online eCourse prior to your class start date & bring the completion certificate to the first class session. The link to the eCourse will be distributed via email at least one week prior to the start date of your class. If you have not received an email by this time, you must contact the community college at which you registered.

Prerequisites

- · Ability to ride a bicycle
- · Valid email address on file with your chosen community college

BASIC RIDERCOURSE 2 (BRC2) | EXPERIENCED RIDERS

This course is designed mainly for experienced but unendorsed motorcyclists; however, endorsed motorcyclists also use this course to refresh their skills. Topics include: braking, countersteering, turning, speed judgment, & other techniques necessary for the experienced rider to operate a motorcycle skillfully & safely. Students must provide their own motorcycle. Mopeds are welcome. Three-wheeled motorcycles are NOT permitted. Sharing is NOT permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, and insured; & it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, & the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection. The course also provides a fast track to motorcycle endorsement (CY); successful completion results in a certificate that waives the written knowledge test & riding-skill test, which would otherwise be administered by the Secretary of State and a third-party testing agency, respectively.

Prerequisites

- · Prior motorcycling experience
- · Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, & insured
- Valid email address on file with your chosen community college

ADVANCED RIDERCOURSE (ARC) | EXPERIENCED, ENDORSED RIDERS

This course is designed for experienced, endorsed motorcyclists to enhance their basic skills & help with personal risk assessment. Interactive classroom activities to improve perception & hazard awareness are combined with range exercises that enhance both basic skills & crash-avoidance skills. You will also learn how to improve braking & cornering finesse. This is the public version of the Military SportBike RiderCourse. Students must provide their own motorcycle. Mopeds are NOT permitted. Three-wheeled motorcycles are NOT permitted. Sharing is NOT permitted. The motorcycle must be titled, registered, & insured; & it must display a valid license plate. Students must provide proof of insurance, & the motorcycle must pass a safety inspection.

Prerequisites

- Motorcycle endorsement
- Ownership of a motorcycle that is titled, registered, & insured
- Considerable street-riding miles
- Valid email address on file with your chosen community college

Students aged 15-17 are permitted to take the Basic RiderCourse (BRC) or Basic RiderCourse 2 (BRC2) if they have a graduated driver's license; however, a parent or legal guardian must accompany them on the first day of class to sign the course waiver.
