Register for Courses WITH your Education Plan

- 1. Log in to *WebAdvisor*, open the Student tab, and click *My Education Plan* under the Academic Planning section.
- 2. Under the Plan Your Degree and Register section, click *Go to Plan and Schedule.*
- 3. Click the right arrow next to the term until you reach the desired term.
- 4. Under the listed courses on the left side, click *View Other Sections*.
- 5. The sections will be listed below the course. Use the arrows to navigate to view each section.
- 6. Click *Filter Sections* to narrow your search (including days, times, locations, online, availability).
- 7. Select the course and view section details; Click *Add Section* (the section will show up on your calendar).
- 8. Click the *Register Now* button above the calendar to register (the course will turn green on your calendar).

Register for Courses WITHOUT an Education Plan

- 1. Follow steps numbered 1–3 listed above.
- 2. Type the name(s) of the course and the course number (or just the subject) in the search bar and click the *Search Button* or *Enter*.
- 3. Select the course and view section details; click *Add Course to Plan*. Do this for each of the courses you want to take.
- 4. Return to *Plan and Schedule*. Follow steps numbered 4–8 above.

Orientation is mandatory for first-time college students and is required before registering for classes. Complete orientation at **schoolcraft.edu/orientation**.

Orientation is not required for transfer students.

☐ Make an Academic Advising Appointment

Schedule an appointment with an Academic Advisor by calling 734-462-4429. Please have your student ID number available.

□ Register for Classes

Login in to WebAdvisor to register for classes at **schoolcraft.edu/webadvisor**.

With WebAdvisor you can:

- Register and pay for classes
- Check on financial aid
- Print class a schedule and view final grades
- Request transcripts and print unofficial transcripts.

Registration for winter classes starts the last Saturday in October and continues through the start of classes.
Registration for spring, summer, and fall classes starts the last Saturday in March and continues through the start of classes

Pay for Classes

Use your awarded financial aid, enroll in the Tuition Payment Plan, or pay tuition in-full.

- In Person: Pay at the Cashier's office in the McDowell Student Center. Cash, check, money orders, VISA, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, and debit cards are accepted.
- Online: Log into WebAdvisor. Under the student menu, choose Payment Options.
- Tuition Payment Plan: Get payment plan information at schoolcraft.edu/student-accounts.



INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS: F-1, B-1, B-2, or M-1 International Students: Additional information is required before an I-20 Form is issued. Go to schoolcraft.edu/apply. Follow the International Student link to download the Prospective International Student Information and Application Packet.

REGISTRATION TIPS

Waitlist: If a course is full, you can add your name to a waitlist. If a spot becomes available, the first student on the waitlist will be notified via Schoolcraft email. Notifications go out each day at 6 a.m. If you receive a notification, you will have until the following day at 11 p.m. to register for that class. If you do not register, the seat will be offered to the next student on the waitlist.

Late Entry/Overload: Students wishing to register for a class after it has met for the first time (late entry), or want to try to get into a class that is full (overload), need written approval from the instructor.

You can get a Late Entry/Overload form from the Registration Center to have the instructor sign, or the instructor can email the consent to registration@ schoolcraft.edu. Bring a copy of the consent to the Registration Center within two week days of receipt to enroll.

Schedule Adjustment: During the first week of the term, you can adjust your schedule as needed, including Late Entry and Overload classes.

Prerequisites: A prerequisite is a condition that students are required to meet before registering for a class. For example, a class that must be taken before taking another class. Students must complete prerequisites as required before enrolling in some courses. Contact your academic advisor for assistance.

DETERMINE TUITION AND FEES

You must pay tuition and fees in full or register for the Tuition Payment Plan within three weekdays, including holidays, from the day you register.

Use the table on page 3 to determine your tuition and fees. Locate the number of credit hours you will be taking for the term, then go to the Total Column for Resident or Non-Resident Rates. The total includes all fees as outlined in the table.

The college verifies a student's residency at admission and for each semester's registration. To qualify for Resident Tuition Rates, students must reside within Schoolcraft College's district, which includes the public school districts of Clarenceville, Garden City, Livonia, Northville, Plymouth- Canton and part of Novi.

FINANCIAL AID AND COLLEGE FEES

FINANCIAL AID

The first step in qualifying for Financial Aid is to fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online at fafsa.gov.

Schoolcraft's FAFSA code is 002315.

Once a student qualifies for Financial Aid, it is applied to the student's account each semester based on the start date of classes to pay for tuition and fees. Any excess funds can then be used to purchase books and necessary class supplies at the Schoolcraft Bookstore.

Schoolcraft College students may qualify for one of the following financial aid programs:

Grants

A grant is a form of financial aid that does not have to be repaid. It is based primarily on demonstrated financial need.

Scholarships

Generally based on academic merit or particular area of study and does not have to be repaid. Apply for Schoolcraft Scholarships at schoolcraft.edu/scholarships.

Work Study

Students are placed in jobs on campus and wages are paid in part by the work-study program. For more information, contact Career Services at 734-462-4421 or email careerservices@schoolcraft.edu.

Student Loans

You must complete a FAFSA application to qualify for student loans. If you are eligible for a student loan, you will receive an email from the Office of Financial Aid advising you of your loan eligibility and next steps. All student loans must be repaid after graduation or not maintaining half time enrollment.

- The Financial Aid Department will send financial aid information to only your SCmail account.
- The FAFSA must be completed every year that you wish to apply for Financial Aid. The FAFSA is available beginning on October 1, annually.

FEE DESCRIPTIONS

Registration Fee

This fee is a refundable fee charged one time per semester regardless of how many credit hours a student registers for during the semester. This fee is \$43 per semester.

Service Fee

This fee defrays the cost of several free services that Schoolcraft provides to students, such as career services, student activities, graduation, parking and admittance to the SC Fitness Center each semester the student is registered. This fee is \$8 per credit.

Lab Fees/Learning Management Fees

This fee is used to cover the cost of special materials, equipment, student assistants, specialized support and other services. Our learning management system fee (currently Blackboard) is \$12 per class, with an additional fee of \$10 for classes held in computer labs, allowing the use of additional technology that is otherwise not available in a standard classroom.

Excess Contact Hours Fees

The College charges \$123 per excess contact hour with a maximum of 4 excess contact hours per class. An excess contact hour occurs when the weekly class meeting hours exceed the class credit hours. For example, if Biology meets 4 hours per week, but Biology is a 3 credit hour class, the student is charged a \$123 excess contact hour fee. If a Nursing class meets 10 hours per week, but the Nursing class is a 4 credit hour class, the student will be charged a \$492 excess contact hour fee.

Instructional Equipment Fee

This fee is used to defray the increasing cost of maintaining, upgrading, and replacing the wide variety of electronic equipment and personal computers used in our classrooms. Software purchases, maintenance agreements, and upgrades are also covered by this fee. Every student is charged \$10 per credit hour for this fee.

Infrastructure Fee

This fee is used to defray the increasing costs associated with maintaining and enhancing the College's buildings, facilities, and campus grounds. Deferred maintenance and depreciation of campus infrastructure is also covered by this fee. Every student is charged \$8 per credit hour for this fee.

COURSE FORMATS

Choose Your Course Format

Schoolcraft College provides students a variety of choices for learning.



Traditional

Traditional 100% on-campus credit courses meet on campus for for each class session. Students are required to attend courses at the times identified.


To ensure the safety of students, faculty, and staff, social distancing protocols will be put into place. Online (ONL)

There are no requirements to meet at set times on campus. Students log in when and where it is convenient for them and are required to keep up with weekly assignments and participate in online discussions.

Please note: online MATH courses require multiple on-campus proctored exams.



Classes meet remotely during the scheduled time via live web conferencing. Blackboard is used to distribute additional course materials, submit assignments, share feedback, view grades, etc.

The required meeting day(s) and time(s) for specific sections can be found in the classroom session schedule under course schedules.



Hybrid (HYB)

Remote Hybrid

Courses combine traditional classroom time with scheduled remote class sessions, all with designated times. It is part "traditional" and part "remote." During the traditional portion, class meets on campus. During the scheduled remote time, classes are required to meet via live web conferencing. Make sure to review the meeting information when registering for a course.



Online Hybrid

A few courses combine traditional classroom time with asynchronous online time. During the traditional portion, class meets on campus at the designated meeting time. The remainder of the course is conducted online and does not have a set meeting time. Make sure to review the meeting information when registering for a course.

Withdrawing from a class means the student no longer wishes to attend the class, but will not receive a refund because the refund/schedule adjustment period has ended. Withdrawing from a class will result in a "W" grade on the official college transcript.

College Closure Due to Weather or Emergencies

If the college needs to close due to weather or emergencies, the closure notice will be posted on the home page of the Schoolcraft website and on the Cancellations & Closings links under website's Campus Life tab. It will also be broadcast on local news radio stations and TV news shows that announce school closings.

Upon registration for classes, all students are automatically enrolled in SCalerts to receive text, email and voicemail alerts regarding college closures due to weather or other emergencies.




